

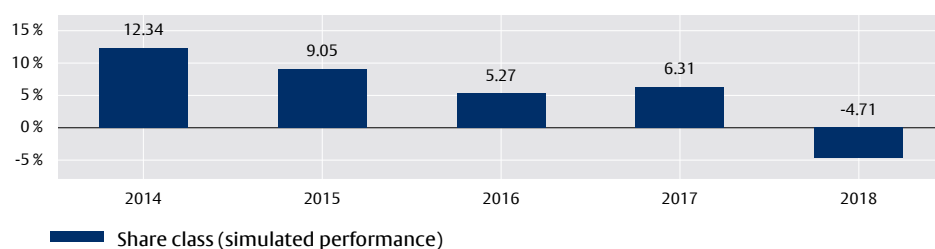


Flossbach von Storch - Multiple Opportunities II - HT

INVESTMENT STRATEGY

The fund pursues an active investment approach. The fund manager can invest in any investment classes that, in his/her opinion, appear to be attractive in the relevant capital market environment. The equity component amounts to at least 25 per cent. The basic principle for asset allocation is an idiosyncratic, independent view of the world. A thorough company analysis is performed to assess whether an individual investment is attractive. A determining factor for each investment decision is the risk/reward ratio. The potential for yield must considerably overcompensate for any risks of loss. The portfolio structure, and thus the fund's risk/reward profile, is aligned to the five Flossbach von Storch pentagram pillars, particularly the diversification principle. The fund is deliberately not oriented to any benchmark index. The main aim is to make attractive yields on a permanent basis.

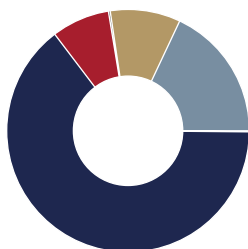

MONTHLY COMMENTARY

October also failed to produce any solutions to the world's geopolitical challenges. The intensity of the trade conflict between the USA and China initially increased – but then subsided again – and the wait for Brexit continues. Global economic indicators are pointing to slower growth. According to official data, Chinese growth was expected to be only six per cent at the end of the period, which would be the lowest rate in around 30 years. The US Federal Reserve (Fed) reduced its key interest rate for the third time in a row to a range of 1.5-1.75 per cent, but signalled it may pause before reducing interest rates again. Equities continued their upward movement. The S&P 500 equity index recorded a new all-time high of 3,046 points in October, and the price of gold also rose. This scarcely benefited European investors, however, as the euro appreciated a good two per cent versus the US dollar in October. Stock-market sentiment was divided. Shares with cyclical tendencies gained ground somewhat relative to more interest rate sensitive securities, which was not that surprising given the recession fears reflected by prices in parts of the market. In addition, government bond yields increased somewhat again at the end of the period – even though German government bond yields remain deep in negative territory. The price of the Fund rose in October and reached a new high during the course of the month. In our view, the equities asset class continues to be considerably more attractive compared to safe bonds. Share valuations are just slightly above their historical averages and therefore offer an adequate “risk buffer” in our opinion. The strategic orientation of the Fund accordingly remains unchanged. The equity allocation of 64.7 % rose slightly due to selective purchases in October, and the (non-physical) gold allocation of 9.4 % serves as a hedge against risks in the financial sector. Our cash position remains relatively high at 18.1 %, which means we continue to have the flexibility needed to take advantage of attractive buying opportunities that might arise.

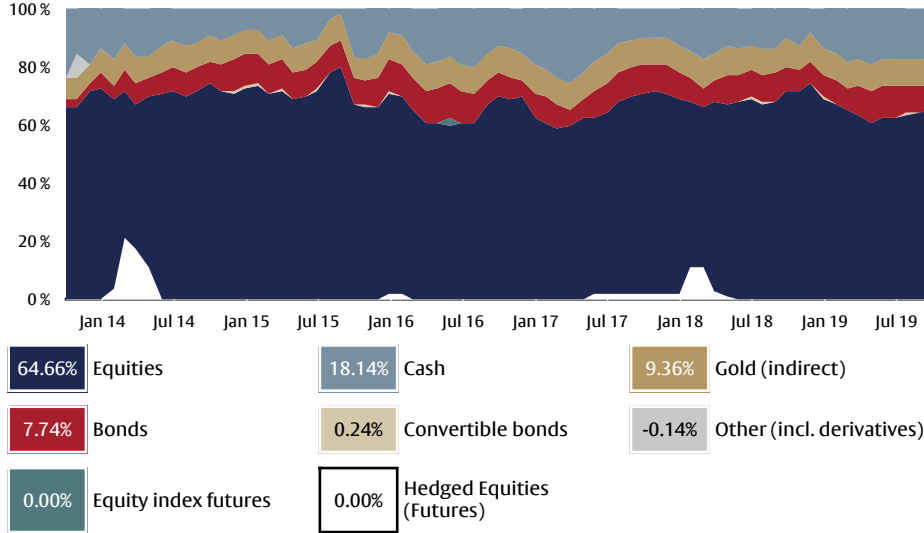
Dr Bert Flossbach co-founded Flossbach von Storch in 1998, and has been a member of the board ever since. He is responsible for the areas of research and investment management.

OPPORTUNITIES

- + Flexible investment policy without benchmarking.
- + Risk is broadly diversified by investing in a range of asset classes (e.g. equities, bonds, convertible bonds and precious metals indirect). Market potential can be exploited by investing across a wide range.
- + Investing in assets denominated in a foreign currency can have a positive impact on unit values as a result of exchange rate movements.

- + Precious metals (indirect) (e.g. in the form of gold) can be used to increase potential yields.

RISKS

- Market risks: The securities in which the Management Company invests the sub-fund assets present opportunities for gain but also the possibility of risk. If a sub-fund invests directly or indirectly in securities and other assets, it is subject to many general trends and tendencies on the markets, which are sometimes attributable to irrational factors, particularly on the securities markets. Losses can occur when the market value of the assets decreases against the cost price. - Risks relating to the use of derivatives: The fund may enter into derivative transactions for the purposes listed in the KIID and the sales prospectus. This means increased opportunities, but also increased risk of losses. The use of derivatives to hedge against losses may also reduce the profit opportunities of the fund.
- Risks of precious metals and commodities: Precious metals and commodities may be subject to greater price fluctuations. Trading prices may also fall.
